#### ABOUT GERDA VAN DAMME'S WORK

Gerda Van Damme's art invites us into an intimate exploration of the human condition—one steeped in existential longing and the ever-present awareness of life's transience. Her work confronts the quiet despair and disillusionment that arise when youthful aspirations collide with the inevitability of aging and mortality. Through a diverse practice that includes paintings, video art, and installations, she both questions and transcends the banality of everyday existence, challenging us to consider if true happiness can ever be reconciled with the struggles that define human experience.

In her methodical approach to capturing life's fleeting moments, Van Damme transforms the passage of time into an archive of personal and collective memory. Whether through hyperrealistic paintings that seem to freeze time, or through a systematic digital cataloging of images and narratives, her art speaks to the legacy we forge in moments that are both ephemeral and poignant. Each canvas, photograph, or installation becomes a repository of memory—a testimonial to the inevitable wearing away of time and the persistence of human emotion.

Central to her visual language is a refined use of monochromatic tones, primarily influenced by Payne's grey—a subtle mélange of ivory black and ultramarine blue. This palette, carefully chosen for its capacity to suggest both absence and light, evokes a simplicity

that belies the depth of her exploration. By superimposing delicate layers of oil paint, she achieves a fragile yet potent visual effect, creating dimensions that range from the quiet intimacy of a  $14 \times 14$  cm miniature to expansive installations spanning up to 10 square meters. This dramatic variation in scale reinforces her relentless inquiry into themes of impermanence and the human quest for meaning.

In recent developments, Van Damme's work has begun to embrace a renewed vivacity through color. Inspired by the luminous warmth of the Andalusian landscape, vibrant hues now interweave with her established tonal framework. Although her commitment to exploring life's ephemeral nature remains unchanged, the introduction of new footage and settings—often staged in the stark expanses of the Spanish Tabernas desert—imbues her work with an added layer of sensory allure. Here, the interplay between the old and the new, between somber reflection and bursts of light, opens up a dialogue on how memory and identity can be both archived and reinvented.

In sum, Gerda Van Damme's oeuvre is a meditation on the fragility of existence and the enduring impact of our fleeting moments—a visual symphony that resonates with anyone who has ever grappled with the depths of human experience.

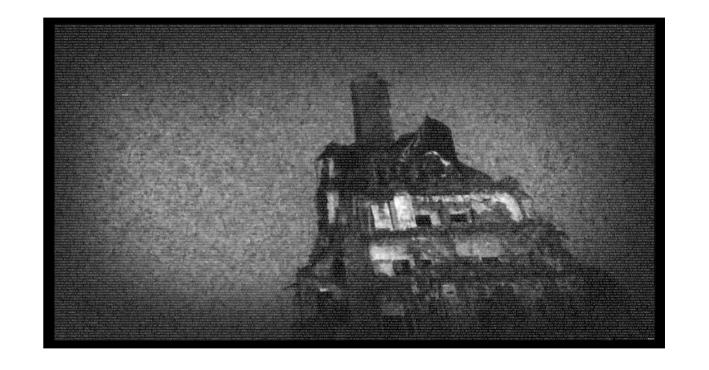
## WHEN THE STARS FELL FROM THE SKY IT TURNED BLACK

This is the bankruptcy of communication.





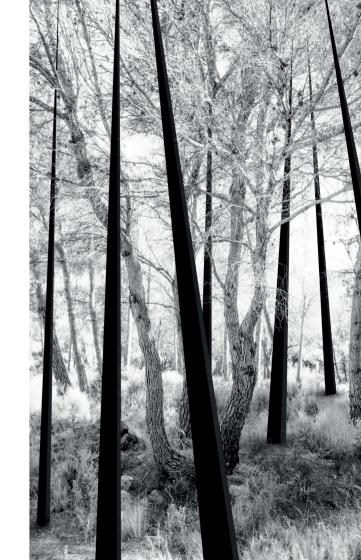

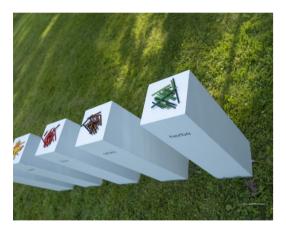

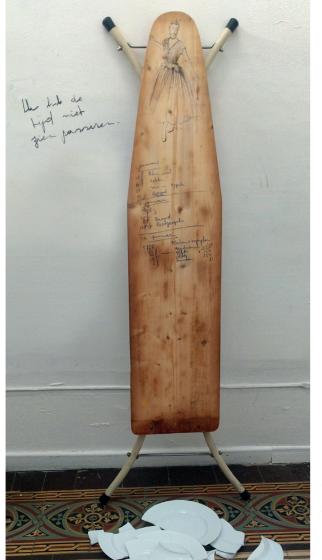
